The Department of Urdu and the Department of English, Milli Al-Ameen College (for Girls) celebrated the birth anniversary of the great Indian writer, Munshi Prem Chand on 1st August, 2024.

31st July, 2024 marks the 144th birth anniversary of Munshi Premchand, a pioneer of Hindi and Urdu social fiction. He was one of the first authors to write about caste hierarchies and the plights of women and labourers prevalent in the society of the late 1880s. His works depict the social evils of arranged marriages, the abuses of the British bureaucracy and exploitation of the rural peasantry by moneylenders and officials. The celebration of Premchand Jayanti gave students the golden opportunity to explore his wide range of works.

The program started with an introduction about the life and works of the writer by Dr Arshia Iqbal, Assistant Professor, Department of Urdu. Then a short film based on the fiction "Buddhi Kaki" written by Munshi Prem Chand was shown to the students. Thus the students were made aware about the literary style of him.
