2. Overview of the State Poultry Farm:

The State Poultry Farm in Tollygunge serves as a notable institution, contributing significantly to poultry farming research and production. It was started in 1959 and is one of the largest and oldest poultry farms in the state. It is a 17-acre farm housing around 20000 birds. It is used as a central hatchery where eggs of different breeds of fowls are incubated and proper hatching is ensured. The main purpose of this farm is to provide fresh, healthy, disease-free chicks to poultry farms across the state. It sells poultry products as part of the governmental initiative related to rural integrated farming practices involving poultry management and breeding. Upon our arrival, we were greeted by Dr. Sudip Sahoo, Deputy Director, ARD (State Poultry Farm), who kindly provided an introduction to the history, mission,

objectives of the farm, followed by a detailed demonstration and tour of the farm. It was enlightening to learn about the farm's commitment to sustainable and ethical practices in poultry rearing.

The tour commenced with an overview of the farm's infrastructure, showcasing well-designed poultry houses, hatcheries, and feed processing units. Additionally, they were provided detailed explanations on formulating balanced and nutritious feed for poultry, highlighting the importance of optimal nutrition. Notable sustainability initiatives, such as waste recycling and energy-efficient systems, were observed, emphasizing the farm's commitment to eco-conscious practices.









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
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VISIT HIGHLIGHTS AND OVERVIEW OF THE EXCURSION
