HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The establishment of Milli Al- Ameen College (For Girls) by the Milli Educational Organisation (registered under the West Bengal Societies Registration - 1961) fulfilled the long-cherished desire of the Muslims of Kolkata to have a degree college for girls belonging to the educationally backward sections of the society in general and Muslims in particular. This is the first-degree College in West Bengal to have been established by the Muslim Community since independence. For the purpose of establishing the same, the Organisation purchased a landed property of about 15 cottahs at 43, Hare Krishna Konar Road, Kolkata, 700014 and constructed a new four -storeyed building thereon according to the plan sanctioned by the Calcutta Municipal Corporation with donations, contributions and subscriptions collected over years from amongst the members and institutions of the Muslim Community. The foundation stone of the College building was laid on March 19, 1984 by the internationally reputed eminent Islamic scholar, Hazrat Maulana Syed Abul Hasan Ali Nadvi.

In the year 1992, in anticipation of getting affiliation from University of Calcutta, the College was formally started with a batch of 40 female students and classes for B.A. (Pass) Two - year degree course commenced under qualified female teachers. Three batches of students appeared successfully in the University of Calcutta Examination as external candidates. However, certain technical difficulties that arose due to the non -affiliation of the college led to its closure in 1996. Meanwhile, the vigorous effort for early affiliation to University of Calcutta continued and eventually after much persuasion the College received a formal letter of approval from the Government of West Bengal (vide G.O. No. 572 Edn (CS) / 4C - 3 / 98 dated . 24.04.2000) followed by the grant of affiliation from University of Calcutta (vide Memo No. C / 590 / 298Affl. dated 02-06-2000). Consequently, the College began functioning as an institution of higher education affiliated to Calcutta University with effect from the academic session 2000-01. The National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions granted minority status to this College under Article 30 of the Constitution of India (vide their order- FNO. 775 of 8th October 2008) issued on 13th October, 2008. The Minority Affairs and Madrasah Education Department of Government, of West Bengal, vide their letter no. 18 MDW / 2009 dated 12.01.2009 confirmed the status of the college as minority educational institution.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Milli Al - Ameen College (for Girls) now stands as a recognized minority educational institution. The College aims at imparting general education, disseminating knowledge, inculcating human values and discipline and developing the total personality with all-round physical and intellectual growth of the students to make them enlightened citizens of India. It endeavours to create an atmosphere adapted to the requirements of female students and congenial to their academic pursuits; to enable them to develop their talents thereby asserting their position in society. The College also believes in propagating secular values that enable the students to adjust harmoniously to a pluralistic society. The medium of instruction is English. The college has applied for the introduction of three new subjects: Journalism and Mass Communication, Nutrition and Hindi

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction is English. However, students are permitted to write their examination answers in Bengali in all the subjects except English and Urdu.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE (AS PER C.U. GUIDELINES)

a) For Major, the candidate must score at least 50% in aggregate and 45% in the subject desired for Honours. except English Major for which the candidate must score at least 50% in aggregate and 55% in English.

Or

b) 55 % marks in the subject desired for Honours or 50 % marks in the aggregate when the candidate wishes to take up Major in a subject not included in the Class XII examination provided all other clauses are satisfied.

NOTE: Aggregate of total marks refers to the total marks obtained in the highest-scoring four subjects excluding compulsory Environmental Education/Studies. If the subject " Environmental Science " has been studied as an elective subject of 100 Marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks. **For SC / ST candidates 40% in the subject and 40% in the aggregate** are required for Major.

DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

Milli Al- Ameen College (for Girls) gives emphasis on discipline. The following disciplinary rules should be noted by the students to maintain decorum in the College:

- 1. In case of continuous absence from College for three consecutive days, a student must submit a letter addressed to the Principal and signed by the guardian stating clearly the reason for her absence.
- 2. Students must bring their Identity Cards daily and especially at the time of the College Examinations.
- 3. Loss of Identity Card should be immediately reported in writing to the Principal so that a duplicate one may be issued.
- 4. Change of permanent address should be immediately notified in writing to the College office.
- 5. In order to avail sports gear of different games in the Common Room, a student must deposit their Identity Card with the College office clerk.
- 6. Students should not loiter in the corridors, passages or sit back in the Common Room during class or leave the classes without taking permission from the teacher.
- 7. Students are not allowed to stand on the terrace or roof ramparts of the College. While visiting the library, all bags must be kept outside. Only money bags, note books and cell phones (switched off) will be allowed inside the library. No printed matter can be carried into the library.
- 8. Violations of any of the rules and regulations of the College will be severely dealt with by imposition of fines, suspension from class or even expulsion from the College.
- 9. Students must not use any unfair means in any examination or class tests.
- 10. Students must not call vendors of any goods into the College premises.
- 11. No business or financial transaction among students should be made without prior permission from the Principal.
- 12. Guardians should not enter the class rooms or the common room of the C ollege without prior permission.
- 13. Students must come wearing decent dress to College.
- 14. Students must not disfigure the walls or furniture or misuse any property of the College or invite outsiders into the common room or classrooms of the College.
- 15. Picnics and Excursions arranged by the College will be notified to the guardians and their written permission will be required before the student is allowed to go on such a trip.
- 16. Students must attend Flag hoisting functions on Independence Day and Republic Day and on other occasions such as College Foundation Day.
- 17. Students must read the Notice Board regularly and follow their daily academic timetable carefully.
- 18. Students must take care of their personal belongings. The College is not responsible for any loss or theft.
- 19. Guardians can meet the Principal with prior permission and/or appointment.

LIBRARY RULES

The College has a well equipped Library and Reading Room for the students to study or do reference work. Besides the Reference Section, there is the general Borrowing Section in which students are allowed to borrow two or three books at a time using their library cards. The following rules apply in the library.

- i. Students must maintain order, discipline and complete silence in the Library and Reading Room. Cell phones must be switched off.
- ii. Each student will be issued Borrowing Cards two for the MDC Course students and three for the Major Course students. Fresh Library cards will be issued at the beginning of every new Academic Session.
- iii. Each student will also be issued one Reference Card which will remain valid throughout their four/three year course of study in this College. Library Cards must be obtained within one month of the commencement of the Academic Session.
- iv. In order to avail Library Cards, Major students must submit 4 stamp size photographs and MDC Students 3 stamp size photographs to the Library Clerk within a week of the commencement of classes.
- v. Books may be borrowed for a period of five consecutive days (excluding Sundays and other Public Holidays) after which a fine of Rs.10.00 / -per book per day will be levied. Books may be reissued on their return for another period of three days if they have not already been requisitioned by others. Books returned late after vacations or extended holidays will be levied a late fine of Rs. 20/- per book per day. All fines must be paid by the students through their respective Fees Book after obtaining late fine / penalty slip from the Library Clerk.
- vi. Books must be handled with care and the borrower must check the condition of the book at the time of borrowing. Any damage or defacement must be brought to the notice of the Library Clerk immediately and before taking the book out of the library. In case of damage found in the book and shown at the time of borrowing the last borrower will be held responsible.
- vii. Any book lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. If such a book is part of a series and cannot be replaced singly, then the entire series must be replaced.
- viii. Should the book lost, damaged or defaced be rare or out of print, the borrower must pay a fine in addition to the published price. Till the damage is compensated, the student's library card will be confiscated and she will be debarred from using the Library.
 - ix. The College Library will remain open during Summer Recess.
 - x. Theft of books from the Library will be severely punished.

LABORATORY RULES

Milli Al-Ameen College (For Girls) takes utmost care in the overall safety of its students inside the laboratory or classroom. The following regulations are enforced in the laboratories of all practical based subjects. At the time of admission, students have to acknowledge that they have received, read, and understood the following general rules, to adhere strictly.

- 1. No students are allowed to enter the laboratory without the prior permission of the teacher concerned.
- 2. All experiments/practicals performed in the laboratory must be approved by the teacher following the safety guidelines, if any, provided. Touching/ working on any other authorized instruments, equipment, setups is strictly prohibited.
- 3. Replacing, swapping, or moving any equipment is strictly prohibited.
- 4. Eating and drinking are not permitted in the laboratory unless having a medical condition already notified to the teacher.
- 5. Students will not be permitted in the laboratory with bare-feet, sandals, or shoes that do not provide toe-coverage.
- 6. When working with hazardous materials, glassware, heat, and/or chemicals, always wear lab coats/aprons, gloves or safety glasses as instructed and under the surveillance of teacher.
- 7. Personal belongings must be kept outside the working area and the aisle must be kept open all the times.
- 8. All the equipment must be placed in the place and state as it was when you entered the lab. The working area must be free of debris.
- 9. Any unsafe conditions, unusual odours, personal injuries must be immediately reported to the teacher.
- 10.Students must know the evacuation routes, lab emergency safety procedures, and emergency phone numbers (pasted on specified places in the laboratory). In case of emergency, the students must switch off any running equipment and follow the standard laboratory safety procedures.
- 11. The student must accept responsibility and pay for any damage she causes to any equipment in the laboratories.
- 12. Silence should be maintained by all inside all the laboratories, except when teachers permit otherwise.
- 13. Adhere strictly to any other additional information provided by the teachers of the respective departments.
- 14. Students who do not follow the laboratory safety rules will be suspended from the laboratory and from college on further non-compliance.

FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS

The College has a spacious Common Room for the students. This is equipped with various indoor games. Facilities for the games may be used by the student if they deposit their Identity Cards with the Office Clerk. The Common Room must not be used to avoid classes or to entertain the personal visitors of the students. Students must keep the Common Room clean and free of litter. Any damage done to the equipment of the Indoor games will have to be compensated by the students responsible for the damage. Students must not invite outsiders into the common room or classrooms of the College. Filtered drinking water is available in college premises for consumption. There is free Wi-Fi connection, canteen, computer lab and e-classroom. Along with these, there is the availability of classes on physical fitness, self-defense, karate training and English improvement classes, Computer skills & other skill development training.


